## FOUR-YEAR CAREER SUCCESS PLAN

## **Undergraduate Business**

- Get acclimated to UNC. Familiarize yourself with campus, academic advising and your academic classes.
- Begin taking Buisness school pre-requisites and focus on getting good grades.
- Create a Handshake account (formerly Careerolina) and get to know the system.
- Meet with a UCS career counselor to discuss your career goals.
- Attend UCS workshops, fairs, panels, and industry nights.
- Get to know your professors. Visit during office hours, and look for current events related to the course to discuss.
- Think about how you would like your resume to look by the time you graduate. What types of skills and experiences do you want to obtain over the next 4 years?
- Follow the B-school Resume Style Guide and template when creating your resume for the application.
- During the Summer
- Develop your professional skills, explore possible careers, and build your network.
- Part-time jobs and volunteer opportunities should be a part of your summer experience. Though any type of job can be beneficial, professional, related experiences will help you test career options, build your resume and make you more competitive in the B-school application process.
- Work on your B-school application essays these are not to be taken lightly or put off until the fall.
- Use Interview Stream to get comfortable responding to behavioral questions.

	Consider a summer abroad.


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## FOUR-YEAR CS CAREER SUCCESS PLAN

- Update your *Handshake* account; update/upload new resume.
- Evaluate summer experience and future plans.
- Start researching job opportunities early. Many employers begin recruiting as soon as the semester begins.

Senior Year

- Monitor application and on-campus interview deadlines of positions posted in *Handshake*. Apply to as many positions that interest you, both within and outside *Handshake*
- Conduct a practice interview with a UCS counselor or the BCC.
- Attend UCS events: OCR Kick Off, panels, meet-ups, info sessions, and career fairs to learn about various employers & career fields.
- Plan your interview attire in advance.
- Once you accept a job, fill out the Future Plans Survey through the Undergraduate Business Program at KFBS.
- During the Summer
- Continue job search if needed- alumni have 6 months of free access to Handshake following graduation.

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
